Violence can happen against anyone, at anytime and anywhere. Violence can never be justified and is never the victim's fault.

People affected by violence are not alone. Help is available. If you are experiencing violence, do not hesitate to seek help! Take the first step and call or write to a counselling centre.

Help others to stay safe: if you witness an act of violence or someone confides in you, encourage the affected person to seek help.

Before visiting a counselling centre, please check the current opening times and make an appointment. Let them know if you need an interpreter. Unless otherwise indicated, the support services these centres offer are confidential and also for non-Munich residents.

Human Rights – as stated in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights – apply universally, in the same way, to every human: You have the right to a live a dignified life in freedom and safety, without violence and discrimination.

Gender-based violence refers to acts of violence in which the affected person's or the offender's gender / gender identity or sexuality play a part. Gender-based violence is a violation of the universal human rights.

This includes (sexual) harassment and discrimination, rape and coercion by a stranger or a familiar person, domestic violence or abuse, human trafficking, forced prostitution and Female Genital Cutting (FGM/C)

The term includes physical, emotional, financial and sexual violence.

HELP AND SUPPORT FOR SURVIVORS OF GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

Help for people affected by sexual or domestic violence

You have the right to live a safe life, free from **sexual or domestic violence**, meaning free from physical, emotional, financial or sexual abuse by an (ex-)partner or another person.

The counselling service is confidential. You don't have to talk about anything you don't want to. Your contact person will believe you. Your past and your current situation will be taken seriously.

If you are at acute risk, you have the possibility to find refuge in a women's shelter or protective space.

Female Genital Cutting (FGM/C) is a major interference with physical integrity and a violation of human rights. This term refers to all procedures that injure or remove the external female genitals without medical reason.

You have the right to decide if you want to get married and who you want to get married to. You also have the right to decide if you want to be sexually intimate with someone and who you want to be sexually intimate with. You have the right to decide if and when you want to have children, and who you want to have children with.

PLACES TO GO FOR MEDICAL CARE

You have the right to physical integrity. See a doctor as soon as possible after sexual assaults, violence or rape:

- For early detection and treatment of (possible) sexually transmitted infections (e.g., yeast infection, HIV-infection).
- To document evidence of the assault for (possible) legal proceedings.
- To terminate a (possible) pregnancy if desired.

In an emergency no doctor or hospital is allowed to refuse treatment, even if the patient has no health insurance. A medical emergency is defined as a situation that requires immediate medical care which cannot be postponed without risking health damage or death. In addition to that, the patient's data is protected by doctor-patient confidentiality and cannot be passed on to any state authorities such as immigration authorities.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT

A Trauma is a deeply disturbing event that leaves you with a feeling of helplessness. It has an impact on your confidence. Emotions and experiences are often felt less deeply.

It is normal for the human body and mind to react to a traumatic experience. Common symptoms or complaints are **difficulty to concentrate and forgetfulness, insomnia, anxiety or irritable and aggressive behaviour.** Some people lose pleasure in things they used to enjoy or experience **sadness and feelings of loneliness.** This is your body and mind showing an imbalance. You are not alone with these issues.

These symptoms are a normal reaction to an abnormal experience!

Many people experience similar issues after a traumatic event. You are neither crazy nor being punished for something. Your issues are human. You have the right to psychological support and help, and there are a number of different possibilities and treatments to ease your symptoms.



PLACES TO GO FOR LEGAL SUPPORT

You have the right to enjoy a life without any type of violence - gender-based violence is a **human rights violation!**

It is possible to take legal action against violence and to use the legal counsel and assistance that is provided for you. The Munich District Court for family proceedings can issue restraining orders for a violent (ex-)partner. The counselling centres Frauenhilfe (Women's Aid), Frauennotruf (Emergency number for women), as well as the Münchner Informationszentrum für Männer MIM (Information Centre for Men in Munich) can help you find a lawyer and assist you in a possible court case.

Gender-based persecution can be recognised as a **reason for granting asylum**. Gender-based persecution includes escaping your home country because of sexual or domestic abuse, forced marriage, FGM/C, human trafficking or discrimination because of sexual identity or orientation. For gender-based persecution to be recognised in the asylum procedure, it is very important to present violent or discriminatory experiences in your home country at the hearing at the BAMF (Bundesamt für Migration und Flüchtlinge, Federal Office for Migration and Refugees). 

State mandate to protect the child's best interests

The Jugendamt (youth welfare office) has a number of duties and responsibilities - their basic duty is to protect children and adolescents in danger. If a child is neglected or abused, the Jugendamt gets involved and cares for the child in need.

In cases of suspected danger to a child's welfare, social workers are obliged to report this to the Jugendamt. When informed of a neglected or abused child, a staff member of the office will talk to the family and possibly also to contact persons of the child. The Jugendamt then offers a number of measures to help and support the family that can be initiated if necessary.

If a child is in acute danger, the Jugendamt can - as a last resort - separate the child from its family for its own safety. The child will then be placed in a foster home or supervised children's home. To do this, the Jugendamt requires a court order from the family court. Only in exceptions, the court order can be given later. As soon as the home situation improves permanently, the child can return to its family.
